Post-doctoral researcher: University of Bern

The Department of Economics at the University of Bern, Switzerland, is inviting applications for one post-doctoral research position in applied microeconomics, under the supervision of Prof. Jeanne Tschopp. The position is for up to 3 years. The successful candidate is expected to independently conduct academic research and to work on the research projects associated with this position. The project will involve studying the economic impacts of hurricanes using firm-level data in India and will be a joint effort with Prof. Martino Pelli, (University of Sherbrooke, Canada). Active participation in the research team and interactions with the

other Professors and PhD students are expected. The position does not involve any teaching. Travel to reputable international conferences is encouraged and covered by a dedicated budget in the second and third year. A sound command of oral and written English is mandatory; German language skills are not required. Candidates for the position should submit a cover letter, a CV, a short research statement, at least two academic references, a job market paper and a list of other academic papers and/or PhD thesis should be sent to susanne.moser@vwi.unibe.ch
